Microchip identification

Microchip identification is a legal requirement for owning dogs and cats in NSW, but not in Queensland. The microchip, placed between the shoulder blades serves as a permanent source of identification and ownership for your pet in case he/she is lost or stolen. It includes life-time registration with the Australasian Animal Registry and is completely painless when given under general anaesthesia. A discount applies at the time of surgery.

Please be aware that there are no pound holding facilities for stray cats in Warwick and Allora. We strongly recommend microchip identification to prevent accidental euthanasia of owned animals.
